Led by Denise Henrikson and Susan Russell, they host art-making events to paint Unity Flags while building friendly relationships between people who are unhoused and housed. EcoThrive Housing Collective is a collaborative committed to demonstrating that we the people have the capacity to create viable solutions to reduce homelessness in our community. This grassroots initiative includes housed and homeless, builders,

landscape designers, social service providers, community development experts, members of faith based communities and a variety of other interested professionals, community organizations and volunteers. We are designing projects *with* those who are impacted, rather than *for* them, and applying the community resources to fit their needs. We are using an entrepreneurial business model that values community ownership, builds on the power of relationships and produces viable solutions that are economically sustainable without ongoing government subsidies. MILLENNIALS NORTHWEST



Millennials Northwest, led by Tamara Johnson, is staffed with youth peer counselors and serves youth at-promise throughout the region, with special focus on the needs in South Seattle/King County. They were recently awarded a grant by United Way to

reduce educational barriers for youth that are caused by behavioral health issues. Their work includes outreach and education on behavioral health issues, early screening, and intervention and referrals to appropriate providers for the youth involved. The grant targets youth who are at risk of dropping out of school that may have undiagnosed behavioral health issues, or are not currently receiving services. NORTHWEST INTERFAITH WISDOM COUNCIL



NICO (Northwest Interfaith Community Outreach) leads our interfaith sector and is concerned about the severely divided environment we experience in the public forum. We are facing severe challenges to our physical, emotional, spiritual and environmental welfare, yet we cannot seem to work together on policies and

practices that advance the well-being of everyone. All the world's religions share the universal principles of compassion and the Golden Rule, but we haven't figured out how to apply the spiritual wisdom of these traditions to the broader community when addressing our priority issues of homelessness, youth at-promise, mental health, institutional racism, immigration and the unsustainable depletion of our natural resources.

The NICO Board, as a step toward unleashing smarter faith-based action for the common good, is proposing the formation of the Northwest Interfaith Wisdom Council. We are presenting a framing statement of strategy with spiritual leaders from 9 major religious traditions, hopeful that by coming together we will be able to speak with one voice and offer a compassion lens and narrative for the local, regional and national conversation.
